Eligibility Criteria

- Identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
- Have a Medicare card
- Have a chronic disease

This includes but is not limited to:

- ◇ Diabetes
 - ◇ Cancer
 - ◇ Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)
 - ◇ Cardiovascular/Heart Disease
 - ◇ Kidney Disease
 - ◇ Mental health diagnosis
- Completed a GP Management Plan in the last 6 months
 - No age restrictions
 - Live in Canberra



Supplementary Services

Yerrabi Yurwang Health Hub has access to funding to pay for medical and specialist services recommended by a client's GP Management Plan (GPMP).

GP Management Plan (GPMP)

A GPMP is developed between you and your GP and outlines your goals and required services to manage your health. We ask that this be done every 12 months and reviewed every 6 months.

715 Health Check

Book in to have a 715 with your Aboriginal Health Practitioner or Nurse every 12 months. This is a head-to-toe assessment of your physical, mental and emotional wellbeing. It helps to identify health issues that can be included in your GPMP.

Allied Health Referral

Sometimes called an EPC referral. If you regularly attend an allied health service such as a podiatrist, physiotherapist, or chiropractor, ask your GP about accessing five sessions through Medicare. A 715 Health Check allows you to access 5 additional allied health sessions (10 sessions total across 12 months).

CTG Scripts

Ask your GP to register you for Closing the Gap (CTG). This means medication on the PBS will be low or no (concession/pension) cost.

How do you access the program?

Step 1 Book an appointment with the Aboriginal Health Practitioner or Nurse for a 715 Aboriginal Health Check

Step 2 The Aboriginal Health Practitioner or Nurse will organise an appointment with your GP to obtain a GPMP

Step 3 Your GP will work with our Aboriginal Health Practitioner or Nurse to ensure that you are provided with the services outlined in your GPMP

Step 4 The Aboriginal Health Practitioner or Nurse will contact you to discuss how we can support you.
